

# IMPORTANT NOTICE

## Care and use of magnetic sheet used for vehicle signs

Magnetic sheet has been used successfully for vehicle signs for over 25 years however in some exceptional circumstances use may result in damage to vehicle paintwork. The following advice may help minimize the risk of such damage occurring but the supplier does not imply or expressly guarantee or warrantee that there will be no adverse reaction between magnetic sheet and vehicle paintwork because they have no control over how the material is altered, cared for, stored and or used, or the surface to which the signs are applied and as such the 'user' must be aware of the risk involved.

- Do not apply magnetic sheet to newly painted surfaces, especially non-factory applied finishes.
- Ensure the vehicle surface and magnetic side of the sign is clean and dry and has had a high quality wax polish applied before placing the magnet in position.
- Ensure that the magnetic sign is removed regularly, cleaned with soapy water, rinsed and dried before re-applying. Ideally this should be carried out daily but as a minimum every two days. In very hot weather it must be done daily.
- Does not use on vehicle body panels that may have been damaged (scratched or cracked paintwork) in the past or that may contain filler.
- Ensure that the entire magnetic sheet is in contact with the vehicle (avoiding heavily contoured areas) and ensure that the leading edges of the sign are free from lumps and bumps.
- When sign is not in use store the signs flat, preferably on a flat steel surface and be aware that it will magnetically attract ferrous tramp from the air and the surrounding environment so always inspect and wipe down the magnetic surface before attempting to use the sign again.
